PLANS FOR TAG DAY Campaign for Affair to Aid Children's Hospital Outlined by Mrs. Hecht

Many Young Women Will Assist in Securing Donations From the Public

War on the San Francisco public was formally declared yesterday morning at a meeting of the children's hospital committee in charge of tag day with the captains of their volunteer army at the California club.

Wholesale captures will be made by the small but valiant army which will set forth to attack San Francisco on November 7. Each prisoner taken will be compelled to pay the enormous sum of 10 cents as ransom.

A letter was read by Commanding General Hecht at yesterday's meeting, from Thomas F. Boyle, chairman of the school board, offering the use of schoolrooms for district headquarters and promising the aid of the school board in securing the co-operation of the school children in distributing tags.

Already the city has been divided into districts, each district to be commanded by one or more captains, according to size, and each captain will have under her from 10 to 20 privates. Another meeting will be held at the California club next Saturday morning, at which time the captains will be assigned to their districts.


Just one notch above the captains in rank will be the lieutenant generals of whom there will be six. Each captain will secure her own privates from among her young lady friends.
