BICYCLE RACERS ARE STILL ON RECORDS

Great Bursts of Speed Are Witnessed in Six Day Contest in Madison Square Garden

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—Plugging away in advance of all previous indoor bicycle records, three teams in the six day race kept busily pedaling and the thousands of spectators who crowded Madison square garden tonight never before saw such earnest work since the saucer shaped track was built 10 years ago.

During the day there were many changes in the relative standings of the teams, but it was not until nearly 5 o'clock that an important shakeup occurred. Then Moran and Macfarland decided they could steal a lap. Moran jumped out with a terrific sprint and Stal almost lost a lap, but his partner, Euit, last year's winner, came on quickly and by hard sprinting managed to regain the lost distance. Joe Fogler of the Fogler-Two-Person team, however, was lapped by the fast flying leaders, and quit. No persuasion by his teammate or the management of the contest could induce him to continue.

"I'm all in," he said. "I've done all I know in this game, and I find I have tamed myself. I can't play any more and can't go any farther." Lawson found no other mate and was officially declared out of the race. The other racers were still on the track at 11 and each hour added new figures to the record.

The score at midnight at the close of the seventy-second hour was as follows: Rutt and Stal, Macfarland and Moran, Hill and Demara, 1,419 miles 8 laps; Walker and Root, Palmer and Walker, 1,419 miles 1 lap; Collins and Mitten, 1,418 miles 6 laps; Galvin and Wiley, 1,418 miles 8 laps; Devonovich and Orbach, 1,418 miles 8 laps; Palmer and Vanoni, 1,418 miles 6 laps; Faber and La Fourcade, 1,402 miles 1 lap.

The former record was 1,411 miles 8 laps, made by Miller and Waller in 1899.

At 1 o'clock this morning the three leading teams had covered 483 miles and 7 laps. This is four miles and 1 lap ahead of the Miller and Waller record.
