LACK OF LOVE IS CAUSE OF SUICIDE

Mrs. Louise J. Jones, Beautiful and Cultured, Finds Existence Aimless

Idleness Creates Void Which Can Not Be Filled by Things Money Buys

Because of her utter loneliness Mrs. Louise J. Jones, a beautiful and cultured woman, committed suicide at the Alta Vista apartment house yesterday by inhaling gas.

Her sole trouble was a great lack of love. All else was hers—beauty, money, charm and education. Her life, to all appearances, had been cast in the easiest of lines. That for which the world daily struggles had been given to her; but it was not until her final notes had been read that her friends saw that beneath her pose of satisfaction and well being had been the crying hunger for the merest crumbs of affection, a pathetic craving for the love which so plentifully shone around her, but which left unlighted the gloom and sadness of her lot.

"I am tired—so very tired of this aimless, loveless life," she wrote in her farewell letters. "It leads me nowhere, brings me nothing."

YEARS OF EMPINNESS
It was her verdict after 10 years of ease and idleness, after 10 weary years of emptiness. She was separated from her husband about 10 years ago, and, as he kept her well supplied with funds, there was no other need for her than to live comfortably.

Then began a life of travel around the country. Her home was in hotels and apartment houses. She had no cares, no children, nothing which necessitated a single sacrifice. She had but to live and await the next remittance from her lawyers, Johnson & Johnson, 255 Broadway, New York. She never complained, never appeared to be worried, but underlying her affability and evident happiness was the increasing horror of the deadening nonentity of her existence, the absolute blankness of the days.

She sought among the walls and strays to discover some child who would answer silent maternal pleadings which had not been answered for had not stifled; but failed to find one. Last Thursday, reading in The Call of a baby girl deserted by its mother, she went to the central emergency hospital with the intention of adopting it. Her friends, however, objected, telling her the world might be apt to put a wrong construction on her motives, and to their advice she listened. On the same day Mrs. William E. Robinson, her cousin, who has been visiting in San Francisco for the last two months, said that her husband's business made it necessary for them to go to Seattle, thereby removing from Mrs. Jones her only relative in this part of the country.

DISPOSES OF EFFECTS
It was the last straw. On Friday night she casually asked Robinson how to go about making her will, and on receiving the information retired. Then in the solitude of her room she summed up her life and came to her ultimate decision. There was no hysterical outpouring of her sorrows in her letters, no complaint. To the lady she wrote a practical note, giving directions as to the disposition of her effects. The letter to her cousin contained the cause of her act, declaring she was simply tired of a loveless, aimless life. Another letter, which was sealed and stamped, was to her lawyers in New York.

When the odor of escaping gas warned the occupants of the house they broke in the room and found her in bed, lifeless. She was about 40 years of age. Her relatives in the east have been notified.

Husband an Invalid
NEW YORK, March 6.—Alexander Jones, husband of Mrs. Louise Jones, is an invalid and travels extensively, as had Mrs. Jones. When they were not traveling together remittances to Mrs. Jones from her husband were made through E. W. S. Johnston, an attorney here. At Mr. Johnston's office today it was said that while the firm had been advised of Mrs. Jones' death in San Francisco, they were unable to assign any reason for her act. Mr. Jones had been in Washington recently, it was said, but his present location is unknown. Mrs. Jones was a Connecticut woman.

CHILDREN IN PANIC WHILE FIRE RAGES

Blaze at Juvenile Detention Home Causes Excitement Among Inmates

Little Ones Promptly Marshaled Into Street and None Injured

The girls' dormitory and surgical room of the juvenile detention home at Tenth and Harrison streets was destroyed by fire yesterday afternoon. No one of the many children domiciled in the institution was injured, but there was a general panic among them during the time the fire raged, and it was only because of the prompt attention and cool headed demeanor of the attendants that the exciting incident passed without an injury.

The little ones stormed and screamed in a panic of fear when from their positions around the tables in the dining room they saw the smoke pouring about them. The attendants took as many as they could hold in their arms, quieted the older children and marshaled them all into the street.

During the uproar 11 year old George Hazenstein ran away and sought out his parents. They returned the lad immediately.

It is believed that crossed electric wires in the dormitory caused the blaze.

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
