Police Scour State for Trace of Affinities in Their Flight

With her two young children to accompany her, Mrs. Ida Watson of Alameda has eloped from her husband with William Russell, said to be an oil operator of San Francisco, and no trace of the quartet can be found.

Watson is frantic at his wife's disappearance with the man for whom she entertained an uncontrollable affection. He has suspected for some time, because of Russell's too frequent visits to his home, and clandestine meetings, that she had in this city, that something of the kind was brewing, but he never dreamed that the woman would take her two children along to share her flight, and at the loss of his wife and children his sorrow is unbounded.

\$4,000,000 BOND ISSUE

Special Election on Issue Will Be Put Before Voters Next June

Plans of the Structure to Be Awarded Big Prize in Competition

A bond issue of approximately \$4,000,000 for a new city hall will probably be put before the voters at a special election some time next June.

That the hall will in all likelihood be erected upon the site of the structure now being cleared away was also tentatively determined upon, although the meeting was largely taken up with the Merchants association's suggestion that the Burnham civic center idea be carried out to the extent of locating the new hall in the vicinity of Van Ness avenue and market street.

Supervisors McLeran, Bancroft and Chairman Hixford took the ground that the work must not be delayed, and that unless the association should shortly make a definite recommendation to the contrary, the board would proceed upon the assumption that the present site be used.

It was agreed that a better plan would be to use the entire amount in stimulating competition, and a bill along that line will be introduced at next Monday's session. The winning architect will receive 4 1/2 per cent of the cost of the structure; it is proposed that the four plans adjudged next in merit should receive prizes as follows: Second, \$5,000; third, \$4,000; fourth, \$3,500; fifth, \$2,500.
