Mayor Hodghead to view The Hetch Hetchy Valley

Berkeley's Executive Will Make Report to the Council as Well as Commonwealth Club

BERKELEY, July 23.—Mayor Beverly Hodghead will leave here tomorrow morning to visit the proposed watershed of San Francisco at Hetch Hetchy valley.

With Mayor Hodghead will go James K. Moffitt, cashier of the First National bank of San Francisco, and a member of the board of regents of the University of California, and Frank Adams, head of a mercantile house in San Francisco.

The primary object of the trip of the committee, which will make a report to the Commonwealth club in September, will be to investigate the suitability of the Hetch Hetchy valley as a watershed for San Francisco and such other bay cities as wish to join in the project for a pure municipal water supply.

These writers, according to Mayor Hodghead this morning, have contributed largely in the eastern press and magazines to create public sentiment in favor of the use of the valley as a water supply.

OAKLAND, July 23.—Thirteen days after their wedding, which followed two weeks' wooing, Elmer T. Cox, an advertising solicitor, has left his girl wife, who was Miss Lillian Gayetta Limbach, at their home, 1315B Market street.

Love grown cold in less than two weeks of honeymoon is the story of the separation as it was tearfully related today by the pretty young woman, who is only 17 years old.

"We did not want our daughter to marry because of her youth, but the young man was so ardent and so persistent and so protesting of his love that he won not only the girl, but my reluctant consent," said the mother.

As soon as the wedding had occurred, according to his wife, burst into a flood of tears a strange action, she thought, for a presumably happy bridegroom. They took apartments at the Wagner in San Pablo avenue, but it was only a few days afterward that the husband, Mrs. Cox said, declared that his prenuptial ardor had cooled to such an extent that he suggested separation for a year.

CORNELIUS P. SHEA Leader in Sentencing Him to State Prison

ROMANCE OF FLAGSHIP RESULTS IN MARRIAGE

NEW YORK, July 23.—Cornelius P. Shea, the former Chicago labor leader, found guilty on Wednesday of attempting to murder Alice Walsh, a former Chicago waitress with whom he had been living here, was sentenced today to not less than five nor more than 25 years in prison.

The former president of the international brotherhood of teamsters listened stolidly to Judge Foster's scathing remarks in pronouncing sentence.

"Your services for humanity are urged here in your behalf," said the court, "because you have been active in the affairs of organized labor. I believe the right of labor to organize, but there is a prejudice in this community, and we must admit its existence, against organized labor, because such men as you dominate it with your brutal methods and your coarse, offensive personality, and a part of the community has come to look upon organized labor as being composed of brutes and securing their victories by brutal methods. But that is all wrong."

"I believe I am helping the cause of organized labor by ridding it of one such as you, and sending you to state prison."
