## CUSTOMERS WATCH

All Goods Except Silk Will Be Admitted Free Within Prescribed Limits

Treasury Issues Instructions for Collector to Keep Count Under New Law

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—Instructions forwarded today by the treasury department to collectors of customs give special attention to imports from the Philippines which are provided for in the Philippine tariff law.

Collectors have been instructed to admit all articles from the islands free of duty except rice until further notice. They are required, however, to report to the treasury department without delay all entries of sugar, tobacco and cigars so that a precise count may be kept on such importations, as their importation is limited by terms of the law. Collectors in the Philippines will report to the treasury the quantity of such articles shipped to the United States and in turn the treasury will check the goods received in this country.

The law limits the free entry into this country from the Philippines of sugar to 300,000 tons a year, filler tobacco to 1,000,000 pounds a year, wrapper tobacco to 300,000 pounds a year, cigars to 150,000,000 a year. The acting commissioner of internal revenue has prepared a circular letter to revenue collectors respecting the removal under certain conditions of the tax on leaf tobacco. No change will take place in the tax on cigars until July 1, 1910, and instructions respecting it will not be issued until shortly before that time.
