Anglers Wait For Arrival Of Big Fish

Delay of the Long Expected Salmon Schools Is Causing Much Worry

Deep sea fishermen are still wondering why the run of Quinnat salmon has not commenced off the entrance to the bay, and the failure of the big fish to put in an appearance in the stretches of water where they were found in large numbers at this season in past years is the chief topic of discussion among sea going hook and line anglers.

As far as is known only five fish have been taken outside with hook and line thus far for the season and four of them were landed by W. H. Campbell of Sausalito, who got his fourth, an 18 pounder, off the whistling buoy near Duxbury reef on Tuesday.

George M. Barnes, the veteran and expert salmon fisherman, has been out three times a week for the last three months, fishing between Point Reyes Light and Halfmoon bay, without getting a solitary fish.

Trout fishermen are still finding the streams and lakes in the distant mountains and in the lower valleys, and the conditions on the Truckee are not as satisfactory as anglers would like to have them.
