ATTRACTIVE STUDIO OF THE KING SISTERS

Artistic Quarters in Which Are Some Fine Miniatures and Water Colors

Carrier Returns From Summer Sketching Tour With Much Material for Paintings

One of the most attractive studios in this city for its odd pieces of pottery, its dainty sketches and the great variety of artistic work on display is that of the two King sisters in Sutter street, near Van Ness avenue. Before the fire their studio was one of the most fascinating in town, for during their stay in the Hawaiian islands and in their travels they had picked up many interesting curios which added to the picturesque setting of their quarters.

Some very pleasing miniatures are now on view, the work of Miss Nettie W. King. Among them may be specially mentioned the portraits of the late Prof. Joseph Le Conte, Mrs. Augusta Porter of Berkeley and Miss Gertrude Rosenthal done on ivory and Mrs. Frank Smith, on porcelain. In all these the coloring is perfect and the expressions of eyes and mouths are exceptionally well caught. Miss King is at present engaged on a miniature of Dr. George Adams of the Congregational church.

Many of the most attractive pieces in her studio are her designs, her plaques. The coloring is truly wonderful with its rich greenish background, the old rose purple and yellow shades of the garments, and the deep rich yellow tints of the two roses reflected in the two faces bending above them.

Miss King has also many beautiful vases and plates of her own designs in her studio. She recently won two prizes for her designs she submitted in the competition for the new Ceramic studio in Syracuse, N. Y. The two plates submitted by her, one with a eucalyptus tree, the other with a eucalyptus seed design, carried off the first and second prizes. Several pieces by her are now on display in the Crafts in Geary street and later in the year she may hold a collective exhibition.

Miss Edith King has a totally different line of work. She has just completed a number of striking cards in the yuletide and new year spirit, which are particularly good, and which may be on sale downtown, but will also be on sale in her studio until the end of December.

One of the most striking little things by her is a conventionalized landscape with an appropriate verse below. An orange path winds up and over a deep olive hillside. The trees on the summit are deep a green as to be almost black and over all is an orange and purple sky softened with purple clouds to represent the sunset glow. It is so deliciously odd and unusual that it is really remarkable and should be placed on public view later in the year.

Another picture by her, equally attractive and in the same conventionalized style, is a moonlight scene in a very deep gray worked up in shades of green and purple, the calm of the sky studied here and there with a few bright stars.

Her regular landscape work is very dainty. She chooses beautiful little quiet corners of nature and handles them with a delicacy and grace that render them distinctively her own. One of the loveliest of these is a study of Berkeley oaks done in shades of gray, the foreground lending a delightful autumn touch to the landscape. Another charming little scene is a study of Tamalpais from Greenbrae. All of her work is done in water colors, and many of them are spring subjects done in the freshest and softest of the season's colorings.

After the first of the year the two sisters may remove from their present quarters and open a studio in the downtown district.

E. W. Currier brought back with him from his summer sketching trip around Tahoe, Glen Ellen and Shasta Springs a number of attractive water color scenes, which are now on view in his studio in Ellis street. Many of these he is at present working up in oils for winter work and two, just completed, he has on view this week in the exhibition now going on in Berkeley in the new Art Institute building in Alkston way. One of these is called "Twilight," the other is a study of San Francisco in a fog, worked up in delicate crayons.

One of the most attractive oil scenes in his studio is in this same note. It is really beautiful, representing the sun bursting through the fog. The subject chosen is San Francisco bay, with the gray fog hanging over the gray water. The hulks of the ships show vaguely through the dense mist and the sky is a heavy sweep of gray. In the center of the canvas a golden sun, faintly tinged with red, makes a broad bright band of light through the fog and over the low waves, giving the whole canvas a warmth and a richness that throws into greater relief the pall of fog. It is a strong canvas, well handled, and shows Currier at his best.

Another very striking scene is a eucalyptus study on the road to Pleasant valley, Oakland. The sky is particularly well done, touched as it is by a few fleeting clouds and the trees are splendidly handled in rich tones of grayish green. There is a haziness to the distance where the road wanders on and is lost in space that is especially good, the whole canvas being worked up with the impression that a drowsy summer heat is over all. This the artist has cleverly brought out.


