PRETTY EXHIBITION OF HORSE RACING
It was as pretty a race as has been seen across the bay for many a season. Four horses faced the starter—Boggs, top weight and odds on favorite; Blackford, not without support at three, and the lightly weighted Edwin T. Fryer and Merlingo. Dwyer sent them away like a chariot team, and for a few jumps Blackford essayed to take the lead.

LEADERS SEESAW TO FINISH
Rounding the last turn the mouse colored neck and shoulders of Blackford flashed in front, and Boggs was cut off and shuffled back. Keene's game gelding ran around his field and set sails for the flying leader, then two lengths to the good. Mentry and Glass both drew their whips and a grilling drive ensued in which Boggs proved victor by three-quarters of a length.

FLYING START HELPS WINNER
A dozen 2 year olds lined up for the first event, with Sonia an even money favorite, and Lady Elizabeth well supported second choice. Lady Elizabeth got off flying and Anderson took her out eight lengths in front. Sonia made a game effort to get up, but was beaten off by two and a half lengths. Blased was a far away third.
