

The Dinner Menu Oyster Soup, Cold Slaw, Roast Duck, Lettuce Salad with Mayonnaise, Calf's Head a la Poulette, Cauliflower, Creamed Potatoes, Roast Beef, Gravy, Baked Apples, Custard, Cafe Noir.

Culinary Notes Welsh Custard—One cup dry grated cheese, four eggs, one half teaspoon butter, two teaspoons flour mixed with the milk, soda size of a pea, half teaspoon of salt, pinch of cayenne, heat milk, stirring in soda, butter, salt and pepper with the flour, which has been wet with a little milk, and pour the mixture into the egg beater.

Monterey Hermit—One and a quarter cups sugar, one cup butter, three beaten eggs, one cup chopped raisins, half cup currants, one teaspoon soda, dissolved in a quarter cup milk, pinch of salt and one teaspoon baking powder in the flour; add spices.

Climax Jumbles—One cup sugar, half cup butter, three eggs, one tablespoon cream tartar, half teaspoon soda (never use baking powder); mix soft and handle with care (do not use rolling pin); flavor lightly with nutmeg.
