STRATTON COLLECTS MINIMUM RATES

Unable to Obtain Ruling in Tariff Matter From Washington He Pursues Safe Course

Washington has not used the telegraph to inform Collector of the Port Frederick S. Stratton where to apply the minimum and maximum rates on shipments under the Payne-Aldrich tariff, and so the collector is now uniformly charging the minimum.

The Payne law provides that the maximum rate shall be applied to all countries subsequent to March 31, 1910, unless the president decides that they are entitled to the minimum rate.


