DIVINITY SCHOOL TO HAVE NEW HOME

As a memorial gift a handsome home for the Episcopal Divinity school is to be erected in the near future on the Taylor street side of the cathedral property and the divinity school will be removed here from San Mateo.

Plans are being prepared now for the building which is to be of brick and stone and of sufficient size for the needs of the divinity school.

The name of the donor is withheld by Bishop Nichols for the present and the exact amount given, but it is said that it exceeds \$50,000.

The divinity school has a site of four and a half acres at San Mateo, but since the destruction of the partially completed buildings by the earthquake in 1906 it has been planned to move the school to San Francisco.

In a public statement issued yesterday to the press, Mayor McCarthy replied in a general way to the series of charges against the administration that have been made by the Bulletin.

To the People of San Francisco: So great an avalanche of defamation and abuse has been heaped upon the fair name of San Francisco within recent days

The infamous and untrue assertion has been made in the columns of the embittered Bulletin that San Francisco has, under my administration, become a gigantic cesspool for vice;

I owe it to every man, woman and child in this city, so long as I am mayor, to keep the city as clean as human endeavor will permit;

The public records will show that the Bulletin's cowardly and lying charges against the name and fame of San Francisco are inspired solely by a hatred and malice that is of long standing;

I welcome a fight to the finish with the boughten Bulletin, or any similar agency or institution that is builded upon the cornerstone of pillage, blackmail and defamation.

The Bulletin's licentious proprietor and editor are still dripping in the blood of this community, and the public has not yet forgotten that these immaculate gentlemen who would teach other men how to live and how to conduct their affairs,

It is not a sufficient answer to a grave public charge to argue that the author of that charge is himself corrupt, saturated in crime and possessed of an evil motive.

Crime is not unbridled or rampant in San Francisco. The city is, and shall be, properly conducted. The women of San Francisco, of whom the Bulletin says that 70,000 are prostitutes,

I shall not have done with this contest, now, until the fittest shall have survived. I can not induce the newspapers of San Francisco, with one or two exceptions, to publish anything that seems to defend or speak well of the union labor administration.
