DAIZEL BROWN AGAIN IN THE LIGHT

Former Banker Says That Barnett Told Him to Hypothecate Bonds

SACRAMENTO, May 11.—The most interesting development today in the case of Isaac Kohn against the Sacramento gas and railway company to compel the defendant to pay interest on certain bonds was the deposition of J. Daizel Brown, who served a term in prison on the charge of stealing the bonds from vaults of the California safe deposit and trust company in San Francisco.

In his statement Brown declared that the California safe deposit and trust company was in dire straits and he wanted to go to New York, so on the advice of Barnett, a director, he took the bonds and gave them to Dr. Allen Griffiths, who borrowed money on them. Brown adds: "I pleaded with Barnett to get some money. Then he telegraphed me, as he had even two years before, to use the very bonds for the purpose of borrowing money which was used in April, 1907, to tide me to use those bonds to tide the bank through."

MUZZLES FOR GOATS WILL SAVE THE TREES

Ordinance Passed to Prevent Ravage of Passing Flocks

MODESTO, May 11.—The county supervisors have adopted an ordinance designed to stop the destruction of the trees which were planted on the county roads by the Woman's Improvement club. It provides that all goats driven along the county roads must wear a muzzle. The greater part of this damage is done by the goats, of which there is a large number with every flock. The goats have destroyed a large portion of the trees planted by the Woman's club during the last year.

SACK GIVES CLEW TO SAFE CRACKERS

Owner Is Arrested as Burglar, but Denies Connection With Robbery

CHAUFFEUR ADMITS KILLING ANDERSON

Driver of Machine Confesses, but Passengers Deny Any Knowledge of Affair

SACRAMENTO, May 11.—A confession was made to the district attorney today by chauffeur Ernest C. Hunt that it was his automobile which ran over John T. Anderson, a Brighton carter, on April 9. Hunt's confession came after he was confronted by evidence gathered by the district attorney that he was the guilty person, although his companions on the fatal ride, August Ruhlstaer and Ben Garrison, have steadfastly denied knowing anything about it. For a month the case has puzzled the authorities. It was ascertained that the pan under Hunt's machine had been broken and removed. It was found and showed stains resembling blood stains. It had been well washed, however, before being cast aside.

Driver of Machine Confesses, but Passengers Deny Any Knowledge of Affair

Hunt's confession carries few details of the killing. He says he ran over Anderson, who was on his bicycle, and went back and picked him up and took him to a hospital. Hunt swore his companions to secrecy because they were afraid of the law. The case will be placed before the grand jury tomorrow. An indictment for manslaughter will be asked.
