Earlier in the day Douglas Lemon, another negro, was found on the street shot to death by unidentified persons.

KREBS, Okla., June 6.—Grubbs Batson, a negro, wanted for an attack on two white girls here late Sunday, was shot and killed by an unidentified man early today.


