The Pacific Mail liner Mongolia, Captain Kitt, was 899 miles away at 8 o'clock Tuesday night, and if all goes well the big steamship will be in port about 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Although the dispatches have reported the liner unharmed the underwriters will not be satisfied until this has been confirmed by a survey made on the dry-dock. It is thought that the purpose of the hull to have escaped some damage as the result of the long continued heavy weather.
