

Herrin Political Bureau Making Desperate Attempt to Stop Curry Landslide

Chosen Squad Will Be Armed With Power of Threats as Well as Promises

With the forlorn hope of saving some of the working railroadmen's votes for Alden Anderson, the Herrin political bureau will send out squads of picked men to labor with the members of the organizations that have formally endorsed Charles F. Curry for governor.

According to the leak from the conference, the railroad political bureau has agreed to select four or five men from each of the organizations represented on the joint legislative board.
