Continued From Page 1... Doctor Goodman attended Tom Kendall several times. He had a chart of the patient's mouth, but failed to identify the jaw merely by description.

There were three molars on the left and two on the right in the jaw which I remember having filled with amalgam, said Doctor Goodman.

CHART OF TEETH

Doctor Goodman's identification is complete and final, said McIntosh. "We are now sure that the son was murdered with his parents. This progress will result in an immediate indictment."

INDICTMENT TO FOLLOW

The next step will be to establish the deaths of the Kendall parents with legal surety. Doctor Goodman thinks the clearing up of Tom Kendall's case will help in this.


PRETTY WEDDING AT OAKLAND HOME
