A. L. Page's Limit Arrives at Vancouver, Running 600 Miles in 58 Hours

VANCOUVER, B. C., Aug. 19.—The power yacht Limit, owned by A. L. Page of Vancouver, won the long distance race from Ketchikan, arriving at 3 o'clock this morning, after the run of 58 hours, creating what is said to be a world's record for power yachting. The distance is 600 miles.

Leaving Ketchikan at 5 p. m. on August 13, the Limit sailed for Vancouver continuously, and although the boat encountered much fog and some heavy weather in Dixon's entrance, it came through splendidly.
