

THREE FAVORITES WIN FOR FORLORN TALENT

Garner Seems to Annex All Mile and Quarter Races Regardless of Mounts

Three favorites found their way down to the wire in front yesterday, and the players had a good afternoon, as these choices were held at liberal odds. The winning favorites were Tender Bloom, in the first race for 2 year olds, at 5 to 2; Buckthorn, in the distance event, at 11 to 5, and Boggs, in the fifth event, over a mile, at 2 to 1. The losing choices were J. H. Barr, Sea Cliff and Godfather.

It was the most successful afternoon that the followers of the choices experienced during the week. Form was well maintained, and with the return of a fast track more favorites can be expected to find their way home in the lead.

Interest centered in the Recreation handicap at six furlongs. It brought out a classy field of six entries, but the race was marred by a poor start, which put the favorite, Sea Cliff, out of it, and a couple of the other entries were off straggling. Jack Payne got away on his toes, and he did not relinquish the lead at any part of the journey, winning by one and a half lengths from Raleigh P D, which ran an excellent race from a slow break. Fort Johnson, R. Mackenzie's clever handicap horse, ran a good race, barely being beaten out for the place. The betting on the winner was 5 to 1. Sea Cliff, while practically out of it, closed an immense gap, and would have had a grand chance of winning with an even break. He was but two and a half lengths back at the finish. Too much weight anchored Enfield.

The biggest surprise of the afternoon was the victory of Darington, which captured the second event at six furlongs. The winner had run a couple of dull races and was overlooked entirely, but he awakened with remarkable suddenness and scamped home with odds of 2 to 1 against him. McIntyre rode him yesterday, while McIntyre had the mount in his previous start. J. H. Barr opened favorite, but he was not wanted, although he stood out on his last race. His opening price of 2 to 1 receded to 7 to 2, and he ran as the betting indicated. The horse was full of run, but he had no chance from where Glass started to make his move. It is easier to guess the jockey that will win than the horse when the mile and a quarter races come along. Buckthorn made it two in three against Molesty, and Garner made it three straight. Molesty had no speed, and Taplin rode a poor race on the gelding. Star Actor, the outsider in the race, made the pace and was only beaten out in the last 20 yards by Buckthorn, which finished with his usual rush. Boggs and gave him a good ride. He took the lead in the stretch and won going away from Nebulous. J. C. Clem was third.

After getting second place on a number of occasions, New Capital finally got a bracket by running an unusually clever race in the final event at six furlongs. Godfather was the favorite, but was never dangerous. Beda made the pace, but was caught at the paddock by the winner. It managed to retain second place. Lady Renaissance was third. David Warfield fell shortly after the start and threw jockey McBride.

The horse went down with a thud and the lad was thrown heavily to the ground. McBride was rushed to the hospital, where it was reported that the boy was not seriously hurt, although he complained of pains in the chest. McBride was conscious when picked up. The accident occurred shortly after the start, and it was fortunate for the boy that the horse was not up with the leaders when he fell.

W. Covington has purchased Wanna, a yearling by Altamex-Ella Boland.

After winning the mile and a quarter event, Buckthorn was run up from \$200 to \$200 and sold to Frank Doss, E. Moran, the owner of Buckthorn, claimed Star Actor for \$25.

W. H. Plourd sold Swell Girl to Allen & Hensley.

Nebulous is consistent, but the gelding seems to be unlucky. He is always there at the finish, but does not seem to be able to get down to the wire in front.

Darington was an old fashioned good thing. A barrel of money was played outside of the track.

David Warfield was played by the stable to win, and the gelding seemed to have a good chance on his previous race, when he was beaten by a nose by Father Stafford.
