

## BIG CROWD IN AT DEATH OF RACING

Popularity of Sport Evidenced by Throngs That Enjoy Last Days

The attendance these days at Emeryville denotes that a popular sport is being legislated out of existence. The crowd at the transbay track yesterday afternoon was one of the largest of the season. In fact during the last several days the crowds have been unusually large. The admirers of the sport have been availing themselves of the limited opportunities of watching the thoroughbred run. The sport yesterday was very interesting and a fine, clear day greeted the spectators.

The starting handicap was the feature event on the card, bringing together a field of classy sprinters, in which Chicago O'Brien's colts, Fluvius, was made an odds on choice. The winner, turned up in the Ralston City stable's entry. Likely Diendonno, which won a stinky victory. It was only Martin's rough riding on Winning Widow that prevented the favorite from coming down to the wire in front.

Likely Diendonno had the early speed. Coming into the stretch, Fluvius was moving to the front on the outside, when Martin on Winning Widow interfered with the favorite wide and when they straightened out for home. When Fluvius was given clear sailing he showed his speed, but Likely Diendonno hung on with unusual gameness and managed to win by a neck. Winning Widow was third. The winner was 5 to 1 in the betting.

An incompetent ride by Pickens beat Silver Knight in the fifth event at a mile and 20 yards. The horse was full of run, but Pickens made a late move and Florida won by a neck. Eddie Graney was third.

Sleepwand won the opening event for babies. The winner ran a clever race under skillful handling by Archibald. Alamitos, which was heavily played, finished second. Voland was third.

Raleigh made a whirlwind finish in the third race at a mile and a quarter and just nipped Jeanian, which made the pace, on the wire. Molesey was also there, being a head back of the second horse.

Fernando turned the tables on Roy Junior in the final event by winning easily by two and a half lengths. Frazier's horse appears to be one of the hardest horses at the track to guess. He ran one of his good races. The betting market indicated that he would, as he was backed from 3 to 1 to 5 to 1. Jessup Burn was third.

Colonel Jack was the choicest plum romping home at 12 to 1. He was well played, too. Martin got the winner flying and he maintained the lead to the end, winning by a neck from Ben Uncas. The latter was easily the best, but was the victim of one of those rides which no other boy but Thomas is capable of handling out. This lad has lost his nerve and is practically useless as a rider. He has burned up a lot of money on horses that figured to win. Veins was third.
