### FAMOUS SCENE TO BE GIVEN AGAIN

#### Catholic Humane Society Will Offer Excerpt From "Nazareth" at Show

The despair scene taken from Clay M. Greene's play "Nazareth" will be the central feature of the vaudeville entertainment to be given by the Catholic humane society in Central theater on the night of February 21 and the afternoon of February 22. The passion play was written by Greene, a former student of Santa Clara college, to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of its foundation, which was celebrated in 1901. Since then it has had three presentations, the present production being, however, the first that has been given beyond the college walls.

John J. Ivanovich, who created the role of Judas and who has played the same part in each of its productions, will again appear in that character. This fact will hold greater interest when it is announced that it will be Ivanovich's farewell performance on the amateur stage, as he will leave for the east immediately after the charity performance to begin an engagement with the Shuberts. Ivanovich will be ably supported in his scene by Joseph Farry, who will play the role of Dathan; August Aguirre, who will be seen as Caiphas, the high priest, and John J. Flordan as Nathaniel. The mob that follows the cross to Calvary will be represented by the students of St. Ignatius college. Elaborate costuming, with a special set of scenery and electrical effects have been prepared for this occasion. The stage management will be under Martin V. Merle, who staged all of the former productions of the passion play in Santa Clara.


