Science Is run by Religion, Says Visiting Cleric

Clarence C. Eaton of The First Church of Boston Speaks at Dreamland Rink

Clarence C. Eaton, C. S. B., a member of the board of lectureship of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, lectured to a large and appreciative audience in Dreamland rink yesterday afternoon under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, of San Francisco.

He was introduced by C. W. Marwood, who said: "Nearly nineteen hundred years ago, as Jesus Christ stood in the judgment hall at Jerusalem, Pilate asked, 'What is truth?' Ever since then, coming down through the ages, earnest seekers have been asking the same question. Many of you are asking that question today.

"Jesus said to his followers for all time, 'Ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free.' "Mrs. Eddy was asking the question, and in her search of holy writ found that God is truth—is all, and discovered, or uncovered, the Principle which heals all our diseases—the Principle by which Jesus and his followers healed the sick, restored the blind, lifted up the broken hearted. This is explained in her book, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures."

"On this cleared and magnified gospel of good news the Christian Science church has been established and is now planted throughout the world. "In addition to local churches to spread this healing truth, The Mother Church, or central church body, has a monthly magazine, The Christian Science Journal, which is published weekly. The Science Sentinel, and a clean, wholesome daily paper, The Christian Science Monitor. Besides these it has a board of disseminating authentic information in lectures of what Christian Science is, what it is doing and how it is doing it.

"I am pleased, on behalf of First Church of Christ, Scientist, of San Francisco, to introduce to you Clarence C. Eaton, C. S. B., of Tacoma, Wash., member of the board of lectureship of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass. "Eaton said in part: "Christian Science or Divine Science may be defined in brief as the knowledge of, or the understanding of, the nature of God, including man—the science or knowledge of God's unchanging law and its fulfillment; or, I may say, it is the science or true knowledge of Christianity.

"Christian Science is not the name for a new or improved religion, but rather it is the most appropriate designation given by Rev. Mary Baker Eddy to the system of divine metaphysics which she has called the study of the scriptures, formulated its advent, less than half a century ago, was by way of the rediscovery and perfection of the divine law of righteousness and its availability in the adjustment, government and control of human conditions and circumstances, not excepting the mitigation and ultimate destruction of all the ills and sufferings which mankind seems heir to.

"It demonstrates that God is supreme in intelligence, wisdom, power, love and love, and, therefore, includes the consciousness of absolute and infinite good. It proves that he is the Mind, Spirit, Soul, Life and substance of all that actually exists; also that he is the author of all true being—the origin and source of all energy and existence, the only cause and creator, and that his works are spiritual, righteous, unchanging and eternal. It declares that the nature of God is the Principle of his creation; hence the conscious, energizing, governing, sustaining power of the universe, whose law means the completeness of perfection and harmonious perfection of all that is. It declares that he is infinite Love; hence he is compassionate, merciful, tender, warm, comforting and harmonious. It teaches that God, our Heavenly Father, is all in all.

THE TRUE AND FALSE CREATION "In this connection Christian Science calls attention to the fact of the existence of two distinct and widely differing Scriptural records of the creation, and insists that they bear no relation to each other. The record which clearly indicates the creating or revealing by an omnipotent and omniscient God of an absolutely perfect and everlasting universe. In its analysis of the account of the creation given by the Lord God (Jehovah) as chronicled in the second account. It will be observed, too, that the second record in detail, formed of the dust of the ground, was the man who is represented as having suffered defilement by evil, and not the perfect man whom God created.

"While no reasonable or satisfactory explanation as to the origin of evil or devil appears in the bible, or has ever been formulated by the theologians, yet we note that modern Christianity has been founded upon the assumed existence of a definite evil being which, theology claims, caused the downfall of God's perfect man—a self-evident impossibility.

"Christ Jesus realized that his redemptive mission could only become efficacious through the destruction not only of the works of evil, but evil itself. Scripture says that he was sent to accomplish that end, and that he was about his Father's business.

"In his book we read: 'For this purpose the son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.' Paul says in Hebrews that it was also the mission of Christ Jesus 'to destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil.' "The conviction that evil is legitimate and a power must be dethroned in mortal thought.

DIVINITY OF CHRIST SUSTAINED "An unreserved belief in the inspired word naturally implies a firm belief in the divinity and the redemptive mission of Christ, for Christian Science argues that there is no warrant, much less permission, for our taking from or adding to the purpose and plan of God. We recognize in Christ Jesus the divine son of God, the blending of humanity with divinity, the evidence of the perfect unity or oneness of God and the real man.

"As followers of Christ we believe in the atonement, the resurrection and ascension; we believe in spiritual baptism and regeneration, and the ultimate reign of harmony and righteousness; in fact, all the essentials incorporated in a pure Christianity enter into the

RAISE from Ellnor-Glyn is no ordinary flattery, because Mrs. Glyn is a critic whose pen is tempered steel and two edged. Which, descending from the metaphorical, means she writes very cutting things with it. And, being fond of flashing it lightly through feminine American fallings, she becomes especially effective, saying amiable things about an American woman.

Since she says them about Mrs. John Hays Hammond, Mrs. Glyn is doubly interesting to Californians in her mood of commendation. In New York last week she said that Mrs. Hammond has an "extremely clever point of view" and is an exception to the usual American wife who has no interest in her husband's affairs. It is this characteristic consideration of self that Mrs. Glyn believes unfits American girls for happy marriages with English men who require much attention and unselfish devotion.

The Hammond ménage is unique in the United States, and ideal, the novelist declares, for there she found an appreciation of man's chivalry and a wife who "shares heartily in her husband's career."

Of course it has been a colorful career, far more so than one that takes a man over a beaten path every day, to all investments with occasional trips to Coalinga. But, although travel and adventure may have appealed to Mrs. Hammond, few women would have followed any career into a Boer prison or through hardships she endured to secure her husband's release. Neither would many matrons in the gay rush of a Washington season with a substituting relative, and go to Russia on a tiresome business journey, which Mrs. Hammond did this winter, spending Christmas with her husband somewhere on the Russian steppes. The Glyn tribute is really not remarkable. It seems rather insufficient on reflection, because Mrs. Hammond might be distinguished as an unusual woman in any country.

CLAY GATES' TAX DATES ARE FIXED

FRESNO, Feb. 26.—Assessors from nine counties met in this city today for the purpose of fixing the assessment rate. The Standard oil company will be assessed \$3,300 per mile for its pipe line and \$45,000 for each one of its pumping stations. The producers will be assessed the same as the Standard. The Associated will be assessed \$3,500 for all pipe lines of similar construction as the Standard but will be assessed \$3,500 per mile for all lines made of rifled pipe. It will be assessed \$46,000 for all stations south of Mendota and \$5,000 for all stations north of Mendota.

Other assessment rates were as follows: Heavy horses \$75 and up; light horses \$45 and up; mules \$20 and up; mules colts \$25 and up; storks and cattle \$12; cows \$25 to \$50; sheep \$2.50; hogs four cents per pound; wheat \$20 per ton; barley \$15 per ton; raisins on ranches \$15 per ton; raisins in packing houses \$20 per ton.
