Doctor Byron Likely to Recover and Miss Patrick Gets Back Clothing

OAKLAND, April 1.—Miss Frances Patrick, the young woman who was the cause of the stabbing of Dr. A. E. Byron at the Alhambra apartment house at Fourteenth and Grove streets, Tuesday night, by her father, James T. Patrick, appealed to the police today for a suitcase which she left in Byron's room the night of the attack.

Mrs. W. Henry, landlady of the Alhambra, had refused to surrender Miss Patrick's property until the damage had been paid for. This demand was denied and Captain of Detectives W. J. Petersen sent a detective to the apartment house today and recovered the suitcase.

It was announced at Providence hospital today that Byron would probably recover. He is suffering from a knife wound just above the heart.

POPULAR COMEDY AT MACDONOUGH

Well Known Actor Brings His Own Composition to Oakland Playhouse

OAKLAND, April 1.—A good laugh, or rather a succession of good laughs, will be enjoyed by those who turn out to see Francis Wilson at the Macdonough theater in "The Bachelor's Baby." Properly speaking, "The Bachelor's Baby" is a farce comedy, with laughter in every line, but with much tenderness and sentiment also. The engagement opens Monday evening for three nights.

Francis Wilson wrote it himself, and he had a record success at the Criterion theater, New York. Audiences elsewhere have greeted it with delight, and it comes to Oakland on a wave of approving laughter. The crusty bachelor is the central figure of the play. His dead brother's little daughter is the baby. Then there is the heroine whom the bachelor marries. The bachelor, indignant at hav-

ing to assume the burden of the child, fuses and fumes, but his fusing and fuming turn to tender solicitude as the plot is developed. The love he finds in his heart for the little girl wins for him the heart of the girl he has loved for a long time. All of this, however, does not describe the humor of the play, which can not be done. Much of it is in the lines and situations, but much also in Wilson himself. Baby Davis is a fascinating baby. Edna Bruns takes the part of the girl in clever style, and the rest of the company is in keeping with the whole.

UNCLE SAM WANTS 30 PHILIPPINE LIEUTENANTS

Vacancies in Constabulary Open to Graduates

BERKELEY, April 1.—There are 30 vacancies in the rank of third lieutenant, Philippine constabulary, which must be filled by August 1, and President Wheeler has been asked by the war department at Washington to aid in the selection of suitable men for the positions.

Under the department rules only unmarried men between the ages of 21 and 23 years are acceptable. They must be of good moral character and habits, and be graduates of reputable colleges or universities.
