

FIVE DAYS FOR COCHRANE AND BANKER KELLEY

Mrs. Henry Also Found Guilty in Kidnaping Case, but Sentence Suspended Attorney Is Object of Scathing Rebuke at the Hands of Judge Mogan

Attorney James W. Cochrane, Mrs. Ivey May Henry and S. Foster Kelley were found guilty of contempt of court yesterday afternoon by Judge Mogan as a result of the investigation into the Henry kidnaping case.

Cochrane announced that he would apply to the appellate court today for a writ of certiorari based on the allegation that Judge Mogan had acted without jurisdiction.

Following the judgment of the court yesterday afternoon by Judge Mogan, Mrs. Henry promised Kelley and Cochrane that she would see that they had plenty of good things to eat and everything else they might desire in the event of their incarceration.

At the opening of the afternoon session Judge Mogan's court on the plea called the circulation managers of the various daily newspapers as witnesses and, through them, introduced into the record of the case the newspapers of the city containing references to the Henry case.

In passing judgment, Judge Mogan said: "I am fully satisfied of the guilt of the respondent, James W. Cochrane, and of the guilt of Mrs. Ivey May Henry and S. Foster Kelley."

"It was his duty, then, as a sworn officer of this court, to appear and give to the court all facts within his knowledge concerning the case. The evidence shows that instead of doing this he schemed and plotted during several days following to evade the order of the court, and I am satisfied that he would have kept these children out of the reach and custody of this court if it had been within his power to do so."

"The defendant Cochrane has failed in his duty as an attorney and an officer of this court, and I do not think this is an instance in which a fine should be imposed. He is therefore sentenced to five days in the county jail."

Judge Mogan said that he was satisfied that Kelley had been a party to the kidnaping plot and imposed a similar sentence upon him.
