"KING MULDOON" LOANERS SCEPTER

Ruler of Notorious Buzzard Club Arrested by Police and Building Is Razed

BERKELEY, April 24.—"King Muldoon," who for years has ruled the Buzzard club, notorious resort of criminals and hoboes, a West Berkeley "speak easy," laid down his scepter this morning when he was thrown into jail charged with vagrancy and the landmark razed.

The passing of the Buzzard club is hailed with delight by the police, who for years have been endeavoring to clean out the place, and a detail of policemen were on hand today to see that a good job was done.

The history of the Buzzard club headquarters is interesting. Many years ago it was the dwelling of a well-to-do family. Then it was sold for taxes.

About 15 years ago Matt Farley, otherwise known as "King Muldoon," moved into the dilapidated structure and set up his court.

Raid by the police have been frequent, especially after the place was conducted as an exclusive "speak easy" and the liquor laws defied.

Initiation into the organization was guaranteed by a bottle of whiskey or a demijohn of rum, and the initiation ceremonies took the form of an "orgy," which lasted for several days.
