

ALAMEDA OFFICIAL DROWNS IN BAY

W. Simpson, City Attorney, Is Jerked Into Water by Running Line

[Special Dispatch to The Call]

ALAMEDA, April 30.—M. W. Simpson, city attorney of Alameda, formerly state senator and one of the best known national guardsmen of California, met death by being drowned in the bay at 1 o'clock this afternoon, when he became entangled in a running line of his auxiliary launch, Carrie L., and was carried overboard. He fought against a racing tide, but sank beneath the eyes of his companion, Justice of the Peace Robert B. Tappan, whose efforts at rescue proved futile.

Simpson and Tappan were the only persons in the launch. The craft was in the channel on the south of Alameda, two miles off the coast of Laurel street, when the running line became twisted about Simpson's foot. In an instant he was jerked from the craft.

Having but one arm, Tappan could do no more than hold the Carrie L. in the hope that Simpson would make the small boat. Tappan began putting the launch about, so that he would be able to pick up the swimmer, but the swift tide drove the craft beyond the swimmer's reach.

It was several minutes before Tappan could throw the launch into its course again. When he had done so, Simpson was gone. The tide had proved too strong.

Simpson, who was 43 years of age, was a major in the 15th regiment, N. G. C. Orders were published this morning directing him to proceed to southern California in company with other national guard officers to spend two weeks in camp with the regulars. Simpson's father, a native of the late William Simpson, was a pioneer San Francisco druggist, having a store near

the water front for half a century or more. He leaves a mother, a sister, Miss Edna Simpson, and two brothers, Howard, employed in the office of the municipal light plant, and George, who is on the Panama canal work. Simpson served as assemblyman and state senator. He lived at 1417 Benton street.

Several years ago Simpson married Miss Isabel Davis after a tempestuous experience with the woman. Her mother had announced their engagement. This was followed by Miss Davis' attempt to kill Simpson. She was disarmed in his law office after a shot from her revolver had gone wild. Subsequently Simpson married Miss Davis, after a grand jury indictment had been returned. A child was born. Still later the woman obtained a divorce.

PROGRESSIVES TO PRESS CAMPAIGN

Good Government Forces Battle to Block Encroachment of County Ring Gang

OAKLAND, April 30.—With the last week of the municipal fight at hand, the supporters of the progressive ticket have prepared for a vigorous campaign. Mayor Mott and the entire ticket will be submitted to the voters of Oakland as opposed to the hybrid county ring-socialist combine, which has been framed to grab the political plums at the city hall.

Leaders of the regular socialist party have denounced the county ring's persistent dealing with groups of socialist candidates. The party as an organization has reiterated through its campaign managers, J. B. Oakburn, H. C. Tuck and others, that it does not stand for political trading. Nevertheless Supervisor Joe Kelley and County Clerk Cook have not abandoned their efforts to form combinations by which socialist votes can be thrown to their candidates.

The fight has settled down to a contest between the progressives and the ring ticket. On one side is a definite program of constructive administration of municipal government as it has been given to Oakland for the last six years. The county ring offers nothing. Its record for many years has been exploited thoroughly. Its fight in this campaign is vital to the rejuvenation of the waning political power of the old guard and the reactionary element in Alameda county politics that has been nearly wiped out of existence.

No concealment is made of the ring's desire to grab the city control for political patronage purposes. They have promised numerous jobs and have offered to surrender about everything in sight for votes against the progressive commissioner candidates. The contest is so clearly defined that the voters

YALE FACULTY MAN TO LECTURE AT U. C.

Summer Session on Campus to Have Many Noted Exchange Professors

BERKELEY, April 30.—Paul Zierman, Prussian exchange professor at Yale university for 1910-11, has joined the faculty of the summer session of the University of California and will arrive here for the opening of the session on June 22.

The German scholar will give three lectures, one in the department of education on "The Educational System in Germany" and two in the department of German on "The Life and Works of Goethe" and "Phonetics With Special Application to German."

Prof. George Santayana of the department of philosophy at Yale is another who will offer courses on the campus. His lectures on "Aesthetics" are expected to prove particularly attractive. He will also lecture on "Philosophical Conceptions."

Dr. Albert Kales, associate professor of law of Northwestern university, is scheduled to give two law courses—"Persons," with a treatment of the law of parent and child, husband and wife and marriage and divorce, and "Future Interests."

John D. Spaeth, professor of English at Princeton, will head the department of English for the six weeks' course. Prof. Frances H. Perry of the University of Arizona will be a member of the faculty of this department.

As head of the department of mathematics Casius J. Keyser, head of that department at Columbia university, has been secured. He is scheduled to talk on mathematics as a mind study.

Harley P. Chandler of the Principia academy, St. Louis, will give a course in California flora, of which he has made a deep study.

one of the features of the session. Miss Clara Palmer of the California polytechnic school has charge of this practical branch, which includes the preparation of dainty repasts every day during the session.

Miss Helen Louise Johnson, director of the Good house keeping Institute of Springfield, Mass., has been secured to head this important department. Her specialty will be lectures on the duties of the housewife in regard to household administration, marketing, buying supplies, purchasing utensils and the like.

Miss Matilda G. Campbell of the Toledo public schools will handle the "foods and nutrition" end of the department.

The playgrounds course, with its 1,000 children, will again be a feature. Everett C. Beach of Los Angeles will again head this department and his assistants will be Marie Ruet Hoyer, lecturer for the Parks and Playgrounds association and School of Philanthropy of New York city; George W. Braden, Occidental college; Signe E. Hagelthorn, Mills college; and Mrs. Marjorie E. Morgan.

Miss Stanford professors will give courses here this summer, Herbert E. Bolton, history, and Albert C. Whitaker, economics.
