

### TAFT CHANGES DATE FOR HIS VISIT TO CITY

President Decides to Come Here for Ground Breaking Ceremony October 13

Charles D. Hilles, secretary to President Taft, wired the Panama-Pacific exposition headquarters yesterday that it had been necessary to change the date of the president's proposed visit to this city.

It has been found necessary to change the route of the president's trip so that he will arrive in Sacramento from Portland at 11 a. m., Friday, October 13. Leave at 1 p. m., arrive in San Francisco 4:30 p. m., remaining in San Francisco Saturday, October 14, and Sunday, October 15, leaving at 8 p. m. Please notify local committee to arrange program accordingly.

### FAN SAYS HIS WIFE TOOK OFF COLLAR

Tried to Prevent Him From Going to Ball Games, He Alleges

Hugh W. Connor, accused by his wife in a divorce suit of having become "helplessly, morbidly, talkatively, morosely and belligerently intoxicated" at various times, filed an answer and cross complaint yesterday, which, because of the character of its allegations, presages entry of a non-suit to Mrs. Ernestine Connor's petition for a divorce if the matter comes before Judge Graham for trial.

Connor alleges that when he tried to leave the house to go to a baseball game his wife tore off his collar. This means of ruining Connor's personal appearance also was resorted to, according to the cross complaint, whenever the husband attempted to go to any place of amusement against the wish of Mrs. Connor.

A denial is entered to all of the wife's allegations regarding the different kinds of "sprees" on which Connor is said to have gone. It is also declared in the cross complaint that Mrs. Connor beat her husband with a hairbrush.

In a divorce complaint filed yesterday Edith A. Schindler accuses Samuel Schindler of treating her roughly whenever she attempted to visit friends unaccompanied by him. She alleges that on several occasions he gnashed his teeth and squeezed her waist until she cried out with pain.

LIABILITY LAW IS IN EFFECT TODAY New Industrial Accident Board Also Commences Its Existence

It will rank with a superior court and will hold sessions at San Francisco to hear all cases under the liability law.

The members of this board are A. J. Pillsbury, Will S. French and Willis L. Morrison. As the result of this law, the Contractors' Mutual Liability company, to protect contractors, has been formed in San Francisco. The surety companies raised rates on the contractors when the law was passed.


