U. C. FACULTIES TO BE ORGANIZED

Purpose is to Promote Relations Between University and Civic Affairs

BERKELEY, Oct. 11.—To promote closer relations in the faculties at the state university and to bring instructors more closely into relation with the civic and social affairs of the state, the various departments are being organized for meetings...

This procedure was urged by Prof. A. E. Leung, dean of the academic faculties. The first department to be organized is that of physical culture, the members of which met last evening at the home of Prof. Walter E. Magee, head of the department...

The next meeting of the physical culture faculty will be held in November, when Prof. V. V. Ligda will read a paper on "The Boy Scouts Movement."

Organization of the faculties of all the colleges in the university will be on similar lines.

SIERRA COMPANY INVADES BERKELEY

Council Informed That Subsidiary of United Properties Will Be Competitor

BERKELEY, Oct. 11.—Notice was served on the city council of Berkeley today by F. J. Blanchard, assistant secretary of the Sierra and San Francisco Power company, that that concern would enter the lighting business in Berkeley...

The Sierra company is a subsidiary of the United Properties of California, which is in competition in Oakland with the Oakland Gas, Light and Heat company, also a subsidiary, and in San Francisco competes through the subsidiary City Electric company with the San Francisco Gas company...

No franchise was granted directly by the city to enter the state laws and constitution providing for such service concerns, but the council attorney states for advice as to whether the competing company can be compelled to pay for its privileges...

Under an agreement with the Oakland Gas, Light and Heat company that corporation pays into the city treasury 3 per cent of the net profits of its Berkeley business.
