Chicago Fighter Comes to Add to "Rep" on Turkey Day

McFarland Arrives Eager to Show Fans 'I'll Trim Murphy and Then Go After Wolgast,' Says Lightweight

Packer McFarland, the Chicago lightweight, arrived last evening in company with his brother, Johnny, and his manager and trainer, Emil Thiry.

"I made good the last time I was in San Francisco and I expect to repeat this time," says Packer. "I can't say much before the battle. I will have to show the fans when I start. Murphy is a good, tough, clever fellow. I ought to know this, because I fought him twice. Any time he is beaten the other fellow must show a whole lot of class."

"Naturally, I expect to beat Murphy, and I expect to knock him out. I will use everything that I have. If I win I will certainly get right after Wolgast. The lightweight championship is my goal. I have been right up close to it several times, but something always cropped up at the last minute. I hope to have some good luck this time."

"I want to fight Wolgast in San Francisco, too. I much prefer this city to Los Angeles. I believe that this is the logical place for this battle, and I will use all my influence to land it here. But I must beat Murphy in the meantime, so what is the use of my talking till I am through with the Thanksgiving day battle?"

"Wolgast has already agreed to take me on at 133 pounds six hours before entering the ring. He can't wait to go back on this now. He has declared himself, and I guess I can hold him to it. I don't care to talk about weight. I will just work out before the fans and show them what I can do. That should be fair enough for everybody."

NOT TROUBLED BY WEIGHT QUESTION
The Chicago lightweight is bright eyed, clear skinned and spry looking. He appears to be much taller than the ordinary lightweight, but appearances are often deceptive and one never can tell till a fighter starts to work and shows his true weight.

The announcement that Jack Welsh of this city has been selected to referee the lightweight championship contest between Ad Wolgast and Freddie Welsh at Vernon on Thanksgiving day took many of the local sports by surprise when they read it yesterday morning. It was a big victory for the champion and his manager, Tom Jones.



In both these battles Barry showed all the necessary class and ring generalship that has won him the fans as one of the real live white hopes.

The Chicago man started his training out at the San Rock lounge yesterday afternoon before a large crowd of the fans. He is still a bit fat, but he looks into good shape within the next few days. He will take on all light weight fighters at the color line either. This should give the aspiring heavies a chance.

There is a big, cumbersome fellow who has won most of his fights here during the last couple of years. He is a tough and willing to mix and game to the core. He gladly accepted the match with the local champion and does not appear to be the least bit worried about the great reputation of the Chicago brawler.

Ray Temple, the eastern lightweight who knocked out Abe Lavelle over in Oakland last Wednesday night, will go against the veteran Rube Miller. Temple has a good punch and can fight. He looks to have the edge on Lavelle at the moment, but he is still a bit green.

Roy Moore, the local bantam weight, is matched with Dummy Thomas. The fight is quite a snorter. Moore showed his ability in the last two fights he had here, but Moore has more than enough to do with the Los Angeles lightweight, who will tackle the Dixie Kid of Los Angeles, a tough performer.
