

Raymond Robins, Before Men and Religion Meeting, Tells Pitiful Story

Speaker Traces Steps of Boy and Girl From Hovel to Downfall

"Whisky, women and the gambler's chance—the old, old story of a young man's downfall," were set forth as the pitfalls in the path of Christianity by Raymond Robins in an address before the convention of the Men and Religion Forward Movement at the First Congregational church yesterday.

"The boy worked for months at the camp," said Robins, "and returned to Chicago with enough money to provide for his mother and with the intention of taking her a present. But one of the men who had been his pal introduced him to the life of whisky, women and the gambler's chance."

"The cost of Christian leadership," said Robins, "is not money, but the sacrifice that must be made to carry on the battle of the church."
