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DESIGNER OF NEW CITY HALL COMING

Henry Hornbostel on Way From N. Y. With Model of Lantern for Tower Top

OAKLAND, May 7.—Henry Hornbostel, member of the New York firm of architects, Palmer and Hornbostel, who designed the new city hall, will arrive in Oakland tomorrow for a stay of several months to assist Supervising Architect J. J. Donovan in preparing plans for the \$500,000 municipal auditorium, which will be built on the southern shore of Lake Merritt.

Hornbostel will render his services in most of the municipal improvements for which bonds have been voted and it is expected that the work of preparing the plans will be given impetus during his stay.

Hornbostel will bring with him a clay model of a lantern which will surmount the tower of the new city hall, 330 feet from the ground. It is the work of G. M. Gusti, a famous New York sculptor, and will be built in Oakland of terra cotta.

The lantern will have four faces modeled after clock dials and will be 10 feet in diameter.
