The special order of business at the meeting of the board of education yesterday afternoon was the consideration of the policy of the board with reference to the opening of school buildings for other than school purposes.

MOTION FINALLY PASSED A motion to grant the request of several associations was carried by a vote of three to one.

The subject of rescinding the resolution requiring teachers to reside in this city came up again, and after a brief statement by Mrs. Louise Herber of the Arguello Boulevard improvement club to the effect that those who draw salary in this city should spend their money where they earn it, and asking time to present a large number of names to a petition protesting against the rescinding of the resolution, it was decided to refer the matter to the board of directors.
