

# NEWS OF THE LABOR WORLD

At the last quarterly meeting of the California State Federation of Labor, held in this city, a request from the California Drug Clerks' association that the secretary write, in the name of the federation, to the International Drug Clerks' association about the necessity of continuing the Drug Clerks' Journal, published in San Francisco, was complied with.

The council was advised that since the previous meeting several hotels and restaurants in Bakersfield have been unionized.

After an address by the organizer for the Humane Legislation league the secretary was directed to communicate with all the central labor bodies in the state, explain the purpose of the San Francisco league and urge them to form branches.

Secretary Paul Scharenberg reported that since the last convention of the federation a vigorous campaign was inaugurated, with the result that 76 organizations of the state had joined the federation, increasing the membership represented in the federation by 5,400; and that now the total membership represented is approximately 61,000.

He also reported that the initiative campaign for home rule in taxation and abolition of the poll tax is not progressing as satisfactorily as was expected, because of the fact that in order to be effective these laws an initiative petition must be those who have registered since the last primary election, and that up to the present time but few have so registered.

The legislative committee reported

adversely on the initiative measure started in Los Angeles, providing for an eight hour workday, \$1 minimum wage per day and seats for employees; favorably on the initiative measure of the State Exchange Produce league; submitted the draft of a bill to establish a state employment office in each of the principal cities of the state; that it had the drafts of several labor bills which would be submitted to the next convention in San Diego, and a summary of the legislative record of members of the thirty-ninth legislature, both regular and extra session, giving their votes against labor measures. This is to be given wide publicity.

At the last meeting of the Building Material Teamsters' local No. 216, it adopted a resolution protesting against the offer of a contractor to furnish teams to the city for \$1 less per team than is now paid, on the ground that, if accepted, it will mean a cutting down of the pay of the teamsters. The secretary was directed to send a copy of the resolution to the board of public works.

The officers of Sheet Metal Workers' union No. 104, were installed on the night of the last meeting, for the current term, by Past President E. J. Frisbie. Three elected applicants for membership were obligated and two members from other locals were admitted by card.
