

TOLL LEVIED BY FLOOD ON SCORES

Thirty-six Known to Be Dead and List Expected to Be Augmented

PITTSBURG, Sept. 2.—As a result of terrific rains last night and early today throughout West Virginia, western Pennsylvania and eastern Ohio, 36 are dead and others missing.

Transportation facilities in all directions from this city were practically put of commission.

After 24 hours of excessive hot weather the storm broke last evening. In addition to an extraordinary rainfall, the electrical features were most spectacular.

At Ford City, Pa., a dozen houses were washed from their foundations. Lightning struck a score of houses, and McKechn, a suburb, is under three to five feet of water tonight.

Cannonsburg is under three feet of water. Business houses are flooded and streets washed away.

Prompt action on the part of the Pittsburg-Buffalo coal company brought 400 miners out of the flood's path.

PRESIDIO AWAITS WAR SECRETARY

Henry L. Stimson Will Be Greeted by Soldiers and Civilians

Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson will arrive in this city this afternoon a few minutes after 2 o'clock direct from Washington, D. C.

JACKSON PARK IS DEDICATED

Mayor Rolph Is Principal Speaker at Pretty Ceremony in the Mission

The Jackson park playground was formally dedicated to the use of the children of the city, and particularly to the use of the Mission district, yesterday afternoon.

The dedication ceremony was held in the center of a crowded part of the Mission district, on Arkansas and Seventeenth streets, on land donated to the city more than 40 years ago by Mrs. Diana Chatham.

Yesterday's exercises drew a crowd of about 6,000 people to the grounds. The football field, basketball courts, tennis courts and children's apparatus were in constant use.

Mayor Rolph, as the chief executive of the city, made the dedication speech. Rev. D. O. Crowley, president of the San Francisco playground commission, presided over the exercises of the day.

The history of the playground movement was told by several speakers. Among those appearing were: George Merrill, principal of the Wilmerding school; Rev. Patrick O'Connell, pastor of St. Teresa's church; W. A. Hanlon, president of the Buena Vista Improvement club; Eustace Cullinan, president of the Mission Promotion association; Rev. W. B. Parker Jr., pastor of the Olivet Presbyterian church, and Dr. E. R. Taylor, former mayor of San Francisco.

A team from Lick high school, led by Captain A. McCabe, and a team from the Cogswell school, under Captain W. Miller, played a hard game of football in the afternoon.
