SHARVES REVEALS

Big "Six" Shows Its Stamina in Strenuous Outing in High Sierra

H. L. Owensby, manager of the local Winton branch, reports that L. B. Hogue, who some time ago made the transcontinental tour from Cleveland, O., to his home in this state in his famous Winton six special, has again been battling with mountain grades and desert wastes. Hogue, in a letter to Owensby, describes one of his most recent tours as follows:

"Mrs. Hogue and I left Ventura May 28, with our car well stocked with home things, and went over to Inyo county for two weeks. We then wended our way along the eastern base of the Sierras, turned east at Big Pine and went to Goldfield, Nev., then to Tonopah and in northerly direction through Sodaville, Hawthorn, Garderville and Carson City; thence up to Glenbrook, around the south side of Lake Tahoe and over the range to the west and down via Placerville, Sacramento, Marysville, Red Bluff and up the canyon near Siesta to the base of Mount Shasta.

"We found some of the worst roads in Nevada and along the east side of the Sierras in California that I ever traveled over in an automobile. We have both voted to stay out of the desert after this. We passed over 10 mountain ranges from the time we left Inyo county until we reached Shasta. Some three of these at an elevation of 8,000 feet and ran down a grade of three miles to the lake, then had to climb to about 8,000 feet again west of the lake.

"Our hotel and boarding house—the Winton six—stood up to the severest test. The engine, which was going wrong. We did not even have a puncture, although we ripped the tires up badly in some places.

15,000 CIGARETTES NEW R-C-H CAR FOR 1913 SEASON

Detroit Factory Prepares to Supply a New Record Demand

According to E. C. Howard, sales manager of the Cadillac Motor Car company, the 1913 season, just starting, promises to eclipse all of the company's past records. "We manufactured and marketed 12,000 1912 models," says Howard, "and have consummated the largest sale of cars in the history of the company since its advent, less than a year ago.
