HOMES OF FIVE IRISH FAMILIES LAIN IN RUINS

Factions Clash at Coleraine When Opponents of Nationalists Open Campaign

“Young Citizen Volunteers” Arm to Resist Proposed Dublin Parliament

ULSTER MEN ARM FOR CONFLICT

“DUBLIN, Sept. 21.—Despite the decision of Augustine Birrell, chief secretary for Ireland, that no movement of the kind will be countenanced or permitted by the British government, the Ulster unionists have determined to organize an armed body to be styled “The Young Citizen Volunteers of Ireland.”

Without the waving of flags and banners, without brass band, and, indeed, without demonstration of any kind, four suffragettes—Mrs. Sheehy Skeffington, Mrs. Palmer, and the Misses Murphy—have been released from Mountjoy prison, on the completion of the term of their imprisonment.

When the English women arrived in prison after being sentenced in connection with the recent Dublin Theater Royal outrage, they also claimed favorable treatment, and three months earlier to that effect. The eight Irish suffragettes joined in the memorial on their behalf, and it was suggested to them that they should endeavor to make a protest before they did anything desperate.

After waiting more or less patiently for a week the English prisoners inaugurated the hunger strike, but the Irish women ate their food and awaited the reply.

Mrs. Sheehy-Skeffington, since her release, has said that she and her three companions determined to make a protest before they came out. And in accordance with that vow they kept a hunger strike for 92 hours as a mark of sympathy with the demands of their English sisters.

They were all agreed that the prison officials had treated them with every consideration, but one of the women made the extraordinary complaint that while the hunger strike was in progress it was a refinement of cruelty to put them in the room as if to tempt the pledged suffragists to eat—and, perhaps, be merry.

“Fortunately,” commented Mrs. Sheehy-Skeffington, “prison food is not very tempting, so that none of us broke down.”

Young Man Paid to Enact Role of Suicide Dies in River Danube

VIENNA, Sept. 21.—That the realistic dramas which thrill the audiences at the picture palaces are not enacted without some risk was shown once more by a grim tragedy that occurred on the Franz Josef bridge at Budapest.

A young man rapidly climbed one of the pillars, mounted the stone eagle at its summit and prepared to throw himself into the Danube. His frenzied gesticulations attracted the attention of large crowds on both banks of the river. Telephone messages were sent for ambulances, and firemen brought ladders, which proved to be too short to reach the suicidal victim.
