Black Notorious in State Politics Shirked Duty In Primary Law Fight

Marshall Black has been closely identified with state politics for the last 10 years, having served both as an assemblyman and a state senator from the old twenty-eighth senatorial district. He served in the assembly during the thirty-fifth session, and then, in 1906, was elected a member of the senate for the thirty-seventh session of the legislature.

Since January, 1907, Black has served continuously in the senate. During the fight over the primary law in the legislature in 1909 he became the victim of a storm when he sought his Palo Alto home on the plea of sickness at a time when the senate was deadlocked over concurrence with the assembly on an amendment to the primary bill calling for a district instead of a statewide vote on United States senators.

Black was re-elected to the senate in 1910 and joined with the administration forces in casting his vote for John D. Works for United States senator despite the fact that Spalding had carried his district. He explained this disregard of instructions by stating that he considered the law governing the case a "force."
