AUDITORIUM PLANS READY FOR COUNCIL

Architect Donovan Completes Specifications for Steel and Concrete Foundations

OAKLAND, Oct. 5.—Detailed plans and specifications for the pile, steel and concrete foundation for the \$560,000 municipal auditorium will be submitted to the Oakland city council Monday morning...

It was found necessary to drive piles from 85 to 75 feet, and to place a steel and concrete "raft" above them to support the structure.

Features of the building will be the beautiful facade, or curtain wall, to protect the halls from the noise of passing streetcars in Twelfth street; the use of inclined planes instead of stairways to facilitate handling the great crowds in the building; the removable skylights to convert the big arena into an open air stadium; the huge stage, with curtain arrangements, by which the arena and large auditorium may be thrown into one vast hall seating 15,000 persons.
