



WARATHS OPPOSE WINGED 'O' TODAY

UNCLE SAM AFTER BLACK CHAMPION

Johnson's Association With White Girl Liable to Send Him to Jail

CHICAGO, Oct. 18.—Jack Johnson's troubles, growing out of his alleged relations with Lucile Cameron, a 19 year old white girl, rapidly multiplied today.

Late in the afternoon Miss Cameron was served with a subpoena, calling her before the federal grand jury to testify against Johnson.

The government is determined to go the limit in investigating Johnson's alleged relations with the colored girl and others.

Johnson was indicted by a federal grand jury a few months ago on charges of smuggling a diamond necklace, valued at \$5,000, into America from London.

Johnson raged when arrested today on a warrant sworn out by Mrs. F. Cameron Falconet, mother of the girl.

His fury increased when the police refused to permit him to see the girl or to procure her release on bond.

Later Mrs. Cameron Falconet appeared before Judge Owens in the county court and swore to a formal complaint that her daughter was insane.

After the papers had been signed Judge Owens issued a commitment order providing for the detention of the girl, pending an investigation as to her mental condition.

Miss Cameron was held by the federal authorities tonight on bonds of \$25,000 as a witness against Johnson.
