Prediction That It Will Take 32 Years for San Francisco to Reach Population of One Million Fails to Find Supporters Among the Business Men of the City

FIGURE IS CALLED TOO CONSERVATIVE

Canvass of Public Service Corporations, Realty Dealers and Builders Reveals Consensus of Opinion That High Mark Will Be Touched in Half the Time

Bion J. Arnold's prediction that it will take 32 years for San Francisco to reach a population of 1,000,000 fails to find supporters among the business men of San Francisco.

Some of the opinions expressed yesterday were as follows: G. A. APPELGARTH, architect—Arnold's estimate is entirely too conservative.

A. F. HOCKENBERRY, second vice president of the Pacific Gas and Electric company—There is a fairly constant relation between growth in the population of a city and the aggregate units of service performed by its public utilities.


POSTMASTER ARTHUR G. FISK—In my judgment, San Francisco will surely have a population of 1,000,000 within 25 years.
