Arouses Ire of Deans of Several Institutions

University of California Is Listed Among Premier Seats of Learning

COLLEGES

NEW YORK, Jan. 12.—If you wish to know "Who's Who" in college land write to the United States commissioner of education, Philander P. Claxton, for a copy of the report of a secret investigation of "all the colleges and universities of this land," made for him by Dr. Kendrick C. Babcock, formerly president of the University of Arizona and now, according to the commissioner, "a specialist in higher education."

But you'll not get a copy unless you happen to have a stronger "pull" than has the ordinary citizen.

COLLEGES

A reporter for the World who applied for one was politely informed that "only 200 copies" were struck off and these had been distributed "long ago" among the deans of the graduating colleges.

COLLEGES

The next best thing to be had at the government's bureau was an elaborate explanation by Commissioner Babcock, covering 12 printed pages, bound in pamphlet form, in the government bindery.

COLLEGES

Commissioner Claxton says that a great mistake has been made; that the government bureau was not sitting in judgment but was only trying to raise the standard for the bachelors' degrees. He regrets the distribution of the report, and says that he is sorry that the report was not made available to the public.

COLLEGES

However, the World did get one of the "only 200 copies" of the private report, and accordingly, is able to give its readers a list of the colleges that are first class and those that are not, according to the opinion of Doctor Babcock. In general, excepting the Catholic university at Washington, not a single college in the United States conducted under Catholic auspices was able to stand Doctor Babcock's test.

COLLEGES

Georgetown, one of the oldest Catholic institutions of learning in the country; Boston college, Fordham, Holy Cross, Creighton university and others conducted by the Jesuits were rated in grades below the first.

COLLEGES

At the report of Chancellor Day's Syracuse university was knocked out of the first class, but when the chancellor demanded "Who's Babcock?" Syracuse was speedily shifted to the first class.

COLLEGES

Many other colleges and universities have been treated unjustly and that he will be doing fighting with the heads of those institutions for a square deal. The College of the City of New York, New York university, Manhattan college (under the auspices of the Christian Brothers), the University of Rochester, Wells college, the University of the South (Carnegie's foundation), Sheffield Scientific School (under the mothering care of Yale) are some of the institutions that have been regarded as "second class." A lot more have been put back this or fourth.

The New York millionaire, whose whereabouts was unknown to the money trust committee for some time, arrived here shortly before noon today on the steamer Miami from Nassau, Bahamas Islands. He at once went to a local hospital.

Mr. Rockefeller, according to an announcement recently made by Dr. Chappell, is suffering from an affection of the throat which makes extended speaking impossible.
