

SENATORS SCORE 'BRUTAL OFFERS'

Solons at Mass Meeting Denounce Those Who Interfered With Suffragettes

Disorder Declared to Mark New Point of Progress in Campaign

WASHINGTON, March 9.—Several hundred men and women gathered here this afternoon in a mass meeting of protest against the disturbance of the suffrage parade on Pennsylvania avenue last Monday and the conduct of the police along the line of march.

Major Richard Sylvester, superintendent of police, and his force were criticised for "mismanagement and incompetency," and those who interfered with the procession were called "brutal loafers."

The speakers were Senators Clapp of Minnesota, Shafroth and Thomas of Colorado and Works of California, Louis D. Brandeis, "Corporal" James Tanner and Charles Edward Russell.

The greater part of the day's speech-making was devoted to arguments in favor of suffrage for women, and the references to last Monday's trouble were largely incidental.

"Last Monday's spectacle," Senator Clapp said, "was a sad one. It is a sad thought that pure womanhood can not march along the streets of the capital of a free nation without insult."

The fact that brutal, depraved manhood could come to insult American women is evidence of the straits to which the evil political system in this country has come in its fight against progress. I believe last Monday's episode will bring the country to the realization that you can not league yourself with wrong against progress and escape the brutal penalties of the acts of the substratum of supporters of wrong."

Senator Thomas told the audience that the disorder of Monday marked a new point of progress in the suffrage campaign.

"The movement," he said, "has passed through the stages of ridicule and argument, and now has reached the point where its opponents resort to physical opposition. From this point it is but a short distance to victory, and the incident of last Monday will soon be forgotten in the blaze of the hostility that will attend the final extension of suffrage to women in every state in the union."

DANIELS TO BE ASKED TO RESTORE YARD'S STATUS

J. J. Madigan Will Call Conference of Merchants and Officials

(Special Dispatch to the Call) VALLEJO, March 9.—The last official act of Secretary of the Navy Meyer before he retired was to issue an executive order placing the Mare Island navy yard in the list of second class naval stations.

One of the highest officials at Mare Island, who asked that his name be withheld, said it was generally known that vessels drawing 27 feet of water had made their way to this yard for repairs many times. Frank R. Devlin of the Chamber of Commerce was certain of what was meant by a "second class yard," but he said that the recent action appeared to be consistent with the award of the contract for the Pennsylvania.

J. J. Madigan, president of the Merchants' association, declared he would call a conference tomorrow or Tuesday of city officials, members of the Merchants' association and the Chamber of Commerce and Mare Island officials regarding the matter. He favored an appeal to Josephus Daniels, the new secretary of the navy.

ARCHBISHOP FAILS AS REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT

Santo Domingo Administration Collapses When Executive Does Not Call Election

NEW YORK, March 9.—Archbishop Noel, provisional president of Santo Domingo, resigned office yesterday and called for a republic, according to a dispatch from the capital of Santo Domingo. The collapse of the Noel administration which was established with the co-operation of the United States after the recent revolution is believed to be due to the hostility of the revolutionary leaders who viewed with dismay the archbishop's failure to call for a popular election in accordance with the compact made with the American commission and the revolutionary leaders November last.

MARTIN MATINEK IN JAIL

Man From San Francisco Accused of Trying to Wreck New Haven Train

(Special Dispatch to the Call) WEBSTER, Mass., March 9.—Martin Matnek, 27 years old, who says he is from San Francisco, is held by the police under 5,000 bonds charged with malicious obstruction of the New Haven railroad. The police say Matnek laid a tie across the track near Oakham station. His case will be heard in the superior court tomorrow. Matnek will plead guilty his counsel says.

BODY FOUND IN STREAM

Napa Coroner's Jury Holds Joseph Izzetti Died From Accident

(Special Dispatch to the Call) NAPA, March 9.—The body of Joseph Izzetti was found today in a stream on the Frye ranch, nine miles north of Napa. Two boys found it floating in the water. The body had lain in the water about 20 hours. The coroner's jury rendered a verdict of accidental death. Izzetti was 45 years old.
