SHRIEKS AND FIGHTS AS IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS DUMP HIM OVER BORDER

Flees to New Hampshire in Newspaper Men's Automobile—Arrested by the Order of Jerome And Is Placed in Colebrook Jail—Found by Sheriff Wandering in Fields Almost Exhausted

"Kidnaped, Kidnaped!" Cried Thaw and Fought Like Maniac When Pitched Into Auto

COLEBROOK, Quebec, Sept. 10.—Michael P. King, a telegraph operator, was one of the few men who saw Harry K. Thaw carried out of the immigration detention room and taken away for deportation. This afternoon he described the scene as follows:

A little after 7 o'clock I saw E. Blake Robertson, deputy superintendent of immigration, pass the window of the telegraph office, was deserted and there was no one on the streets. I could hear the throbbing of an automobile at the end of the platform. Suddenly I heard a voice crying: 'Let me go.' Some one else hollered 'Come on.'

I looked out and saw that the men had Thaw by the arms. Thaw was fighting and screaming like a maniac. The policemen handled Thaw mighty roughly and pitched him into the automobile. There were three of them.

"One man jumped to the wheel and away they went in a cloud of dust. The last I heard was Thaw's voice crying, 'Kidnaped, kidnaped!'"

COLEBROOK, N. H., Sept. 10.—Fighting and shrieking "Kidnaped," Harry Kendall Thaw was rushed across the international line in an automobile this morning by Canadian immigration authorities and dumped into the United States at Norton's Mills, Vt. Grasping a forlorn opportunity, Thaw headed across the New Hampshire state line in a last effort to reach a yacht or liner and hurry away to Europe, but was finally captured at a little school house five miles from Colebrook.

THAW SCREAMS AND FIGHTS
'I won't go with you,' screamed Thaw when Deputy Superintendent of Immigration E. Blake Robertson aroused him in the immigration detention quarters at Colebrook, Que., and showed him a warrant for his ejection signed by Minister of Justice Doherty, who is also acting minister of the interior.

This is a case of kidnaping. This is an outrage; I want to talk with my counsel. You can't plot with Jerome to get me back to Mattewan," Thaw screamed.

He had to be almost forcibly dressed, and grabbed a bottle and hurled it through a window of the room. Fighting and screaming he was shoved into a high powered touring car, which started for Norton's Mills.

DUMPED FROM AUTO
At the international boundary Robertson told Thaw he was a free man, if he did not fall into Jerome's clutches, and Thaw promptly ran toward newspaper correspondents, who

There was no change in Lane's condition this morning and Dr. T. C. McCleave, who attended him yesterday, gave an order for complete rest.

Dr. Clark Burnham of Berkeley is now in attendance on Lane. Mrs. Lane stated this morning that she was not worried over her husband's condition, as he has suffered from similar attacks for several years and that they would keep him in absolute quiet for two or three days.

As soon as the cabinet member is able to travel he and Mrs. Lane will leave for a sojourn at some quiet resort, so that Lane may enjoy a relaxation before taking up the duties of his office. Lane's Los Angeles trip has been indefinitely postponed.

Spanish Princess, Deaf Like Brother, Is Becoming Dumb
MADRID, Sept. 10.—Another cloud of sorrow has settled down upon the royal household of Spain. It was learned today that little Princess Marie Christina, aged 2, has become totally deaf and is gradually losing her power of speech. Her 5 year old brother, Prince Jamie, is deaf and dumb. Queen Victoria is heart broken and for three weeks has daily prayed for an hour in the chapel of the castle, imploring divine intervention against the approaching affliction. Special prayers are also being said throughout the city.

LOST GIRL IN OAKLAND Seen at the Festival

Despite the fact that the police have been searching for Georgia Cameron, the 15 year old schoolgirl who has been missing since Monday, on the supposition that she was suffering from amnesia, and despite the various rumors that have been in circulation concerning her whereabouts, the first real clue to the mystery came this morning, when Valois Pendola, 523 Guerrero street, reported having seen Miss Cameron in Oakland yesterday during the Native Sons' celebration.

Mrs. Kate Spector, living at 715 Castro street, telephoned to Mrs. Cameron this morning, after she had read the description of the girl in The Call, that she believed she saw Miss Cameron.

According to Mrs. Spector the young girl, who fits Miss Cameron's description accurately, even to clothes, was walking along Castro street trying to open doors of stores which were closed for the day. The girl appeared decidedly nervous and she disappeared from the neighborhood as mysteriously as when she came.

Mrs. Cameron, mother of Georgia Cameron, declared that "the snobbish treatment accorded her daughter by the sorority girls of the high school which she attended" had left a deep impression upon her, girlish mind, leaving the child morose and de-

pressed. This snobbishness, according to Mrs. Cameron, even went so far as to bring forth a rebuke from the principal of the school.

"My daughter had absolutely no intention of leaving home," sobbed the distracted mother today. "The morning of her disappearance she took a little lunch, waved me a goodbye as she was leaving and smiled just as she has always done. That is the last I have seen of her.

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BOWIE BEAT WIFE, SHE TESTIFIES

Mrs. Carol Bowie, member of a prominent Kentucky family, was granted an interlocutory decree of divorce today from Hamilton Campbell Bowie Jr., son of Dr. and Mrs. Hamilton Campbell Bowie of Palo Alto, by Judge Franklin A. Griffin upon the wife's testimony that her husband treated her cruelly.

Bowie is a nephew of Henry P. Bowie Hillsborough millionaire and Japanese scholar, and of Allen St. John Bowie, manager of the Standard Electric company of San Francisco. He is well known in club circles as "Cammie" Bowie, has a ranch in Madrone, and his income, according to the wife, is from \$500 to \$1,000 a month.

"I left my husband on October 1, 1912," Mrs. Bowie told the court. "He treated me in a very cruel manner during the last two years of our married life. On January 20, 1912, at Los Angeles, when I was returning with friends from a party, my husband struck me with his closed fist, knocked me to the ground, cutting my lip open until it bled. He hit me very hard and I was compelled to stay in the apartments two weeks after that. Two or three times before that he struck me. My husband swore at me and called me names and said he wished he could get rid of me."

The wife said that Mr. Bowie had paid her from \$7 to \$8 a month, although his income is from \$500 to \$1,000. Judge Griffin awarded her an interlocutory decree and \$75 a month alimony.

ORDERS NORCROSS TO COUNTY JAIL

The commitment of David C. Norcross, secretary of the Western Fuel company, to the Alameda county jail until he is ready to bring before the federal grand jury the books of the corporation was signed this morning by United States District Judge Maurice Dooling. The fine of \$2,000 was also ordered against the company. Both are on charges of contempt of court. The fine and sentence were passed last week, but a stay of execution was granted until this morning.

Shortly after the commitment was ordered Norcross appeared at Marshal Elliott's office with his attorney, Samuel Knight, and surrendered. Attorney Knight made a motion for habeas corpus, which was refused.

Following this he announced an appeal to the United States district court of appeals, and asked that Norcross be released on bail pending the appeal.

SENTENCE OF ELOPERS IS POSPONED

Maury I. Diggs and E. Drew Caminetti will not know the punishment Judge William C. Van Fleet plans for them until next week.

When the cases were called for judgment at the opening of court at 10 o'clock, Theodore Roche, special prosecutor for the government, moved that sentence be deferred until the case against Diggs and Charles B. Harris, a Sacramento attorney, is completed. Diggs and his attorney are accused of subornation of perjury.

Both of the young men who were convicted of violating the Mann act in the unfortunate elopement to Reno, Nev., from Sacramento with Lola Norris and Marsha Warrington, appeared for sentence.

Probably sentence will be passed Tuesday.

Roche is of the opinion that the case against Harris and Diggs can be submitted during the three court days of the present week.

The case of the government will be established by Marsha Warrington, Lola Norris and Nell Barton, the Sacramento girl who met Diggs and Harris in the office of Harris and carried the promises of Diggs to Miss Warrington, who was to change her testimony to protect Diggs.

Harris will testify in his own behalf. A dozen character witnesses will be called by the defense.
