COPPETTES WRITE OF THEIR DUTIES FOR CALL READERS

Preventive Work Among Young Girls is Aim of Miss B. A. McCall of Oakland

Preventive work, among young girls particularly, and moves for the encouragement of more clean amusements for Oakland is the aim of Beatrice A. McCall new copette of the transbay city, secretary of the Women's Protective bureau. She describes for Call readers what she hopes to accomplish.

My work as head of the women's protective bureau of Oakland will take me further upstream than the probation office work I have been doing. The work will be to prevent crime and disease and poverty as far as possible, to reach the young girl who has just begun to visit cafes and to build up for her in Oakland clean amusements and to make wholesome the atmosphere in which she lives, thereby preventing the next steps in the downward path and saving for

the community a wholesome unit instead of trying to reclaim one who has already sunk in the mire.

I shall, however, continue the work already established, but to see that they and those women who are brought there as drunks or drug users will be helped to get on their feet and regain their self-respect as well as that of the community.

Among the poor we shall work to bring into their lives a little sunshine in the way of more wholesome and cleanly surroundings. We shall interest the philanthropically inclined to aid financially the poor or sick or otherwise in need in other ways. ROUND UP WITH LAMB LIFEBELT CREW

Aryan Has Tough Time With Hod Carrier, Tailor and Waiter Seamen

Trouble was a passenger on the American clipper ship Aryan, Captain Charles Granzow, which arrived last night, 175 days from Baltimore. Shortly after the vessel left the eastern port, it was discovered that all but three of the crew were landlubbers, or, in the unvarnished vocabulary of the sea, "stiffs." They included a hod carrier, an automobile repairer, a waiter and a tailor.

The Aryan was 21 days rounding Cape Horn, where the weather proved so inclement that more than half the crew took to their bunks. There were only two men on duty August 20, when a terrific gale hit the ship, and when the wind blew away the sails there were no sailors to take in.

Fire broke out in the carpenter shop August 21, and for a time threatened to destroy the ship. First Mate Funck was thrown to the deck off Cape Horn and suffered a dislocated shoulder. He was injured a second time about a week ago.

According to the complaint filed by Mrs. Irving, her husband has been guilty of many indiscretions.


