From the Memphis Appeal of yesterday we copy the following in regard to the New York State Convention which met at Syracuse on Tuesday.

The two Democratic conventions of New York have met, transacted business and adjourned. The leaders composing them and the citizens they represent are farther apart than ever.

A terrific tornado visited Marshall Mo., last Sunday evening. It is reported that near one hundred people lost their lives, among them all the physicians of the town, besides one or two hundred wounded.

The St. Louis Republican's Marshall special says that seventy-one victims of Sunday's storm have been buried, and some twenty-five or more are in a dying condition. The number seriously hurt is about one hundred and fifty.
