ORITUARY.—Died, at the city of Washington, on Sunday, the 12d instant, Judge Thomas Pegg, one of the delegates of the Cherokee nation now in this city. The deceased was born in the State of Alabama. He was one of the "old settlers" to the West, and has been for a third of a cantury a wominant cities or public official of the century a prominent citizen or public official of the nation. He has been president of the upper branch of the legislature, and judge of the supreme sourt. In December, 1890, he became the second officer of the celebrated Katonka, or 'pere' League, the first secret Union League in the United States. In 1862 he became captain of company B, 3d Indian regiment, and served with his company until bon-orably discharged at the close of the war. He was a prominent exhorter in the M. E. Church. As acta prominent exhorter in the M. E. Church. As acting chief he signed the bill abolishing slavery in the Cherokee nation, February, 1863...the first legislative act abolishing slavery by any local or State authorized to the United States. He was a full blood Cherokee, a man of considerable attainments, and of great shrewdness and asgacity. At the time of his death, besides being one of the junges of the supreme court, he was one of the legally elected representatives of the Cherokee. gally elected representatives of the Cherckes nation, and laboring with them to secure the just rights of that people from the Government. He death will be felt as a public loss in the nation.

The funeral took place yesterday afternoon at ! o'clock, from Joy's, corner of Eighth street and Pennsylvania avenue. The body was interred in the Congressional burying-ground.

An employee of the Bavarian Mint has An employee of the Bavarian Mint has published an improved process of silvering copper, brass, and other alloys by means of a solution of silver in cyanide of potabelum. The difference from the small method consists in the use of sinc things, with which the objects are coasted, when the silvering solution is applied, an immediate deposition of a much more durable character taking place. The filings are easily removed by rinsing in water, and may be used repeatedly for the same purpose. Metallic iron may be coated with copper in the came manner, by substituting for the silver a solution of copper in cyanide; and over this copper deposit a coating of silver may be applied.
