In order to arrive more clearly at the particular point that we wish to make at this time, we will extract from the above so much as relates to the "judicial officers," for none of which has any male inhabitant "the right to vote at any election" in either of the six New England States—omitting all superfluous words. It will then read as follows:

"But when the right to vote at any election for the choice of electors for President and Vice President of the United States, representatives in Congress, executive and judicial officers of a State, or the members of the Legislature thereof, is denied to any of the male inhabitants of such State, being twenty-one years of age, and citizens of the United States, or in any way abridged, except for participation in rebellion or other crime, the basis of representation therein shall be reduced in the proportion which the number of such male citizens shall bear to the whole number of male citizens twenty-one years of age in such State."
