WASHINGTON NOTES AND IMPRESSIONS.

GENERAL LAND OFFICE.—The surveyor general, at Boise City, Idaho, has transmitted a report to the Land Office, showing the completion of the survey of twelve townships north of Solomon's river, in the central part of the Territory, embracing an aggregate area of 379,490 acres. This tract adjoins the reservation set apart for the Nez Perce Indians, under treaty stipulations, and the surface is generally high and rolling prairie, in some places mountainous, covered with fine fertile timber. The prairie portion is very fine, well watered and well adapted for agricultural and grazing purposes. This tract embraces a large number of settlers who have operated some beautiful farms and fine improvements. The geological formations of this section are basaltic and granitic.

THE WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENT. The Boston Herald says that some two or three years ago Congress granted a charter for a grand opera house in this city, but nothing has been done in the way of building it until within the last few days, when parties of means have been looking about for an eligible site.

CHIEF ENGINEER KING. In charge of the Bureau of Engineering in the Navy Department, has returned here from a tour of inspection of the naval stations on the Pacific. He reports that the navy-yard at Mare Island, San Francisco, when completed, will be the finest in the world.

THE LOUISIANA CONGRESS. The Louisiana Legislature is trying to induce Secretary Belknap to recommend the establishment of a navy-yard at New Orleans. They set forth the claims of the Crescent City in preference to Mount City, Ill., at which place it is also contemplated to make a permanent navy-yard.

THE COMMERCIAL APPOINTMENT. The commission appointed to take testimony in the New Orleans Farragut prize-money case will be ready to make his report to the Supreme Court of the District about the 1st proximo. The distribution of prize money cannot, therefore, take place for the holidays.

THE FOLLOWING AMOUNT. was yesterday transmitted to the Avondale sufferers by William Huntington, treasurer of the fund for their benefit in this city: Proceeds of concert of African club, \$300.25; officers and employees Washington navy-yard, \$128.60; sundry sources, \$10. Total, \$439.45.

SECRETARY BELKNAP. Estimates that the reduction of the clerical force of the several Departments which has been made since the inauguration, will result in the saving of \$1,800,000 per annum. That will be for the Government, but had for the business of Washington, as it is one million dollars at least taken from the retail trade of this District.

HON. DAVID A. NUNN. who was appointed minister resident to Ecuador last April, is now in Washington, and will shortly tender his resignation. Mr. Nunn is one of the stalwart Union men of Tennessee, and his appointment without his consent, and his part gave great satisfaction. The reason assigned for his resignation is the smallness of his salary, and the fact that no provision is made for a secretary of legation at that mission.

THE PATENT OFFICE.—During the week ending yesterday there were filed 233 applications for patents, 90 patents and 243 patents ordered to issue on the 24th inst. The only patent issued yesterday to the District of Columbia was to David Metz for an axle box. Baltimore obtained four as follows: Frederick H. Smith, column or tube for engineering or other purpose; Charles E. De Vin, machine for threading bolts; Charles T. Gilmer, tobacco press; John C. McCarthy, of New York, patents a horse power engine for extinguishing fires.

RE-SURVEY OF DISTILLERIES.—The following regulation in regard to the re-survey of distilleries has been established by the internal revenue bureau. When the change is to reduce the capacity or increase it by the opening of sealed tubs, no re-survey is necessary, but in such case it is only necessary that the assessor shall make a report on the blank form furnished for that purpose, which embraces the distiller's application and assessor's certificate. Where the change of capacity is an increase by the use of additional new tubs, no re-survey is necessary.

GRAND GERMAN OPERA IN WASHINGTON.—Mr. Maurice Grau, the agent of Mr. H. Grau's Grand German Opera Company, was in town yesterday and concluded arrangements for a short season of grand German opera at the National theatre, commencing on Monday evening, November 22. The company is an excellent one, and comprises such artists as Messrs. Frederic, Rotter, Johansen, Delius, Meiers, Himmer, Heilmann, Armand, Formes, Heinecke and Wendel. The chorus and orchestra will be complete and good. This company has just concluded a long and successful season at the Theatre Francaise, New York.

THE PERSON OFFICE COMMISSIONER sent to the South-west to examine alleged frauds in pension papers are still at Nashville. They report to the pension bureau that they do not find the wholesale frauds that were rumored when the claims from that section were suspended, although there are some individual cases. A large number of cases have been sent forward with the recommendation that the order of suspension be removed and payments ordered. They find a large number of cases where extraordinary fees have been taken from the pensioners and payments drawn by attorneys without their knowledge. The commission will continue its investigations for some weeks longer, until the whole ground is gone over.
