THE CENTENNIAL. The opening scenes of the Centennial Exposition are described elsewhere. It seems that the arrangements were not complete; but the inauguration of the Great Show was an impressive demonstration. In the presence of royalty and Republican simplicity of the representation of all the nations and many of the minor nations of the earth, and of the accredited industry, skill, art and science of the globe, it was begun. It is an event of historic importance not only as a political celebration—the hundredth anniversary of the birth of republican government in the New World—but as the first exhibition of an international and cosmopolitan character ever attempted on this side of the ocean. Purely state or national exhibitions have been frequent; but this is the fourth international one, the first being the World's Fair in London in 1851, the second the French Exposition in 1855, and the third the Vienna Exposition in 1859. But our readers are familiar with these facts, and it only remains, as a matter of interest to them, to suggest that the tributes of respect to our nationality—the youngest on the foot-shoulder serve as an admonition to cherish a patriotic love of country and to increase our national pride. The long strides of advancement that we have made since this continent was no more than a howling wilderness have placed us as a people in the front rank of civilization. In the arts, sciences, literature, manufactures, and particularly in inventions, we are almost without competition. Even in our youth we show the strength and vigor of manhood, and this combination of our resources with older nations will prove that our complete ascendancy is not a matter of the far distant future. Above all things, this occasion should be made useful as an incentive to personal as well as national

deeds which startle and appal, and denies the assertion of Conway, that there is no devil.
