CITY NOTES.

Narah Hill, a small colored girl, was in the dock of the Police Court yesterday, charged with being a vagrant. She was committed to jail for thirty days, in default of \$10 fine.

Belgian bond pavement has been laid along the track of the Fourteenth-street railroad on New York avenue. A comparison with the pavement of the Columbia railroad running parallel with it is entirely unfavorable to the latter. There are generally about a dozen people standing at the corner of New York avenue and Fifteenth street waiting for cars on one of three lines which meet there. It would be a good idea if the roads were laid on a level with the depot or waiting-room at this point, and it would certainly meet with favor in the eyes of the public.

Last evening about 3 o'clock, a carriage, containing Lieutenant Smith and his child, was overturned at the corner of Market and Seventh streets. It was forced in a pile of paving stones. Mr. Smith was very badly hurt, and was taken to the Washington Hospital. The child was not hurt, and was taken home by a friend.

Joseph Simmons, a handsome little fellow, in the summer, was brought into the Police Court yesterday by John George, with being an idle and incorrigible boy by his grandfather, Mr. Johnson Simons. The old gentleman, who was almost bent double with age, told the court that Joe was very bad, and that he would stay out all night, sleeping in stables and wagons, and that he would run away from home and stay six weeks at a time, and when he came back and was asked where he had been, he would say "No where." That his mother was dead, and that his father had gone away, and that it was impossible for him to control him, and that he was getting in the habit of stealing. Joe went to the Reform School during his minority.

WORSHIP IN THE WOODS.

THE CLOSING DAY'S SERVICES AT WASHINGTON GROVE CAMP—ABOUT FIFTY BRAINS PLUCKED FROM THE BURNING—DEATH OF A CHILD ON THE GROUND.

WASHINGTON GROVE CAMP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, MD. AUG. 21, 1877.

This is the last day of an encampment which has been held here every year since 1865. It has not been exceeded by any camp that has been held on the ground.

The weather has been favorable throughout, the temperature of the atmosphere at no time oppressive, the air balmy and pleasant, and indeed, everything has transpired to make the camp what all have universally accorded, a decided success.

The number of souls converted was not so great as formerly, but never was God's people so wonderfully blessed and baptized for future usefulness as during the past two weeks.

The meetings, from beginning to end, have been profitable and pleasant, and accompanied with great demonstrations of the Spirit of God. The number of ingathered souls cannot be computed till after the last service in the evening, which will probably reach fifty, and maybe beyond.

The sermon of last evening was preached by Rev. Chas. Smith, pastor of Cross-street (M. E.) church, of Baltimore, from St. Luke's gospel, 18:45. As large a number professed conversion as at any preceding meeting.

This morning brought us a bright, beautiful day for the closing services. The gathering from the country began at an early hour, but was not so great as from the city or country, as had been expected. The congregations during the day, however, were just large enough to be pleasant.
